

1st Timothy 1

1. What was Timothy's family situation? (Acts 16:1)
2. What was Timothy's reputation at Lystra & Iconium? (Acts 16:2)
3. How did Paul become an apostle? (v. 1)
4. What expression does Paul use to describe his relationship with Timothy?
 - a. Who else does Paul describe this way? (*hint: Titus 1:4*)
5. Where had Paul encouraged Timothy to remain? (v. 3)
 - a. For what reason?
6. What are "genealogies," and why would they have been a concern in Paul's time and culture?
 - a. *Thought question (answer if you know, but don't worry about it if you don't):* What modern religion concerns itself with genealogies, and why?
7. What 3 qualities are commended in verse 5 as being the "end" (goal or purpose) of Paul's instructions?
8. Some people swerved aside to what? (v. 6)
9. What did some people *desire* to be, but could not? (v.7)

10. According to verses 10 and 11, for whom is the law made? (feel free to give a general answer, not every specific act)
11. Some of our brethren teach that alien sinners are not under the gospel law but what does 1 Timothy 1:11 say about this?
- a. What does 1 Corinthians 9:21 say about it?
 - b. What law are we under according to Galatians 6:2?
12. How did Paul describe his condition *before* conversion? (15)
13. What was Timothy to wage according to verse 18?
- a. What was Timothy to fight according to 1 Tim. 6:12?
 - b. What warring / fighting terminology is used in 2 Tim. 2:3-4?
14. What had some allowed to happen to their faith? (19)
- a. What particular individuals are referenced?
 - b. Paul said that he had personally “delivered” these men “to satan” that they might learn not to blaspheme (v. 20). The same action was to be taken by the Corinthian church according to 1 Corinthians 5:5. What action is represented by this phrase? (see 1 Cor. 5:9-11 for help).
 - c. What do we learn from 1 Cor. 5:5 and 1 Tim. 1:20 about who is responsible for taking this action?
