- 1) What problems/sins are addressed in this chapter?
- 2) The first problem (vs. 1-8) involved several oversights on the part of the Corinthian saints: They overlooked:
 - a) Who was qualified to judge moral matters Who did Paul say was qualified?
 - b) Who was not qualified to judge such matters Who was not qualified?
 - c) What the saints should have been willing to tolerate from others: What was this?
- What notion or theory about salvation were the Corinthians told not to be deceived into believing? (v. 9)
- 4) 1 Cor. 6:12 and 1 Cor. 10:23 give the two rules governing scriptural expediency: What are these rules?
- 5) (Thought question) From verses 12-14, what can be inferred about the reasoning that some Corinthians used to defend the practice of fornication?
 - a) What was Paul's answer? (18)
- 6) What do we learn from 1 Corinthians 6:16 about what constitutes "one flesh?"
 - a) How does this passage help our understanding of Matthew 19:4-6 with regard to marriage and sexual relations?
- 7) How is the Christian's body "the temple of the Holy Spirit?"
- 8) How does the "temple" of 6:19 differ from that of 1 Cor. 3:16, 17?
