## 2 Corinthians 2

- 1) The 2 Corinthian letter is unique among Paul's epistles in its personal depiction of the apostle's emotions. In chapter 1, Paul confessed to having "despaired even of life" (v. 8). What does Paul confess to needing in verses 1-4 of this chapter?
- 2) Why would Paul's first epistle to the Corinthians have caused them "pain?"
  - a) The real cause of the "pain" is identified in verse 5: Who was this person? (for help see 1 Cor. 5:1-ff.)
  - b) What action had the Corinthians [finally] taken that was "sufficient" for this man? And what is implied by the word "sufficient?"
  - c) Upon this man's repentance, what action was the church to then take towards him?
  - d) What would be the result if they failed to do this? (7)
- 3) According to verse 11, what does Satan have?
- 4) Titus' failure to appear in Troas caused Paul some concern: What was Paul hoping to hear from Titus? (for help, skip ahead to 2 Cor. 7:5-7)
- 5) What two "fragrances" did Paul present? And to what two kinds of people? (be prepared to give a brief explanation)
- 6) What does it mean to "peddle" God's word?
