- 2. Peter again mentions his need to "remind" the saints of certain things:
  - a. Of what did he remind them in 1:12?
  - b. Of what does he now remind them (chap. 3)?
- 3. Who is contrasted with the "holy" prophets that are here mentioned? (see 2:1 and 3:3)
- 4. What were the "scoffers" teaching?
  - a. *Thought Question:* Using Peter's reply, describe the over-all view that was held by the scoffers:
  - b. To what modern scientific/evolutionary theory do they compare? (hint: they believe that species naturally evolve over millions of years of time)
- 5. What cases of divine intervention did Peter cite in refutation of their theory?
- 6. What commonly ignored or misunderstood aspect of God's nature often leads humans to erroneous conclusions? (see vs. 8, 9)
- 7. What will happen on the day of the Lord?

- 8. Considering 2 Peter 3:13 and Isaiah 66:22, why do some people conclude that Peter is speaking figuratively of the destruction of Judaism and the beginning of the church age?
- 9. How should the knowledge of future physical destruction of the universe affect one's spirituality and conduct? (11, 12, 14)
- 10. Whose testimony does Peter corroborate?
  - a. How does this speak to the inspiration of the Scriptures?
  - b. What does Peter acknowledge about Paul's writings?
- 11. Does "hard to understand" mean the same thing as "impossible to understand?" Please explain:
  - a. According to Peter, who "twisted" the Scriptures?
- 12. In what are we to "grow?"
  - a. What does this growth prevent from happening?
