 - b. How is this difference in reaction described in Acts 14:4?
 - c. What did *unbelieving Jews* do to some Gentiles?
 - d. What do we learn about these Jews from verse 19?
 - e. By verse 5, what 3 groups are identified as opposing the apostles?
- 2) Paul healed a man at Lystra: How does this man compare to the one that Peter healed in Acts 3?
 - a. How did the people of Lystra react to this healing?
 - b. What is Barnabas called in verse 14? Explain:
- 3) Acts 14:17 makes a case for God based upon a consideration of the things that God does for mankind:
 - a. What case is made for God in Romans 1:20?
 - b. What case is made in Psalm 19:1-2?
- 4) What did Paul's enemies do to him at Lystra?
- 5) Though the narrative is brief, what significant thing happened at Derbe?
- 6) What things did Paul and Barnabas do when they circled back through Lystra, Iconium and Antioch? Which Antioch is referenced in verses 26-28, and what is suggested about this church in these verses?
