 - a. What argument is made by sectarians from 1 Cor. 11:26 regarding the frequency of Lord's Supper observance, and how is their argument refuted by Acts 20:7?
 - b. Who ate bread in verse 7? Who ate bread in verse 11?
 - c. On what floor did the Troas disciples assemble? Is this binding?
- 4) Why did Paul decide to not spend time in Asia?
- 5) Who did Paul call to him while he was at Miletus?
 - a. What are they called in verse 28?
- 6) What do verses 20, 26 and 27 say about the nature and style of Paul's preaching? (compare Psalm 119:6)
- 7) What was Paul "bound in spirit" to do?
- 8) What did Paul say would happen to the church at Ephesus, even among its elders?
- 9) What fact greatly saddened the Ephesian brethren?
- 10) What did Paul do to assist his travel companions (v. 34)? What practice does this authorize today?
