

Acts 21

- 1) As described in verse 1, what thing was difficult for Paul and his companions to do? (*Hint: read also verses 37, 38 of chap. 20*)
- 2) What warning to Paul did the disciples at Tyre have in common with the disciples at Caesarea?
 - a. Acts 21:4 tells us that the “Spirit” was involved. How do we harmonize this statement with Paul’s words in Acts 20:22? *For help, see verses 11 and 12 of chap. 21, and 20:23:*
- 3) Where did we first learn about “Philip?” What was his role at that time? What did this develop into in Acts 8?
 - a. Philip had 4 daughters who prophesied. Read 1 Timothy 2:12 and 1 Cor. 14:34 and be prepared to explain the limitations upon their teaching.
- 4) What prophet came from Judea to Caesarea, and what did he tell Paul?
 - a. How did Paul react to this news?
 - b. What did Paul say he was prepared to do?
 - c. From Acts 20:24, how did Paul react to the notion of suffering?
- 5) How was Paul received by the brethren at Jerusalem?
- 6) What did James and the elders ask Paul to do?
 - a. Why?

- b. What charges did the Jews make against Paul?
- 7) Jerusalem was in “an uproar” over Paul. What previous city in Acts had also been in an uproar over Paul?
- 8) What did the Jews do to Paul? What did they *want to* do to him? (vs. 31; see also 22:22)
- 9) What is significant about the way in which Paul was transported?
- 10) Who had the Roman commander assumed Paul to have been before Paul spoke to him in Greek?
- 11) Why did Paul speak in Aramaic?
