- 2) What actual sin did Ananias and Sapphira commit? What was their fate?
- 3) What do we learn from the story of Ananias and Sapphira with respect to property ownership does God allow it?
- 4) Verses 13 ("none of the rest joined") and 14 ("believers the more added") appear contradictory, but Scripture cannot contradict Scripture (Jn. 10:35), so what is the explanation of these verses?
- 5) Trace and describe the numerical growth of the early church: Acts 2:41 > 2:47 > 4:4 > 5:14:
- 6) What did some people expect to happen as a result of Peter's shadow being cast over the sick? Is there any proof that they actually got what they wanted?
- 7) Compare the reaction of the Sanhedrin (5:17) with their reaction in 4:2: How does it compare to 5:33?
- 8) What did the Sanhedrin do to the apostles? How did God respond? How did the Sanhedrin officers handle the apostles the second time they approached them (verse 26)?
- 9) How did Peter and the other apostles reply to the high priest? What does this reply teach us about the limitations of civil law?

- 10) Of what did Peter accuse the high priest and his councilmen? Has Peter done this before? (hint: 2:36; 3:15; 4:10)
- 11) In what sense was the Holy Spirit a "witness?"
- 12) From Gamaliel's speech, what do we learn about his nature and character?
- 13) From Acts 22:3, what can we infer about Gamaliel's view of the Law and his approach to interpretation?
- 14) What two possible consequences did Gamaliel suggest in regard to the plans and works of the apostles:
 - If of men...
 - If of God...
- 15) Was Gamaliel successful in making his case?
- 16) What was done to the apostles before their release?
- 17) How did the apostles react to their treatment? What did they do "daily" after their release?
