Questions On Amos Chapter 2

- 1. The first 3 verses of this chapter pronounce judgment upon Moab. The kings of Israel, Judah and Edom had allied against Moab (see 2 Kings 3 for that history). Though the account of this action is not listed in the Kings narrative and likely happened after that account in retaliation against Edom, for what act was judgment pronounced against Moab?
- 2. The judgments against other nations primarily targeted the people for their crimes against their fellow man. However, with Judah it was different (vs. 1 & 2). For what reasons was judgment being passed upon them?
 - **a.** The last statement in verse 4 addresses what common problem of religious people?
 - **b.** According to Jesus in Matthew 15:3 and 9, what are the consequences of following mere human *tradition*?
 - **c.** What would God send upon Judah and Jerusalem? (Thought Question: When would this happen?)
- **3.** List the crimes of Israel (vs. 6-8):
- **4.** Like Hosea, Amos cites some of the great things that God did for Israel. What things are listed in verses 9-11?

- **a.** The term "Amorite" was a general term for the Canaanites. What particular ones were described as being giants? (see Numbers 13:32-33)
- 5. In order to help Israel, God raised up some of their sons to be _____ and some of them to be _____ (v. 11)
 - a. According to Numbers 6:3, what were Nazirites to avoid drinking?
 - **b.** But what did Israel encourage the Nazirites to do?
 - c. What did Israel discourage the prophets from doing?
 - **d.** According to Amos 7:12-13, who was one of the prophets who was told to not prophesy?
- **6.** Whether Amos meant that *God* was pressed down, or that the *sinners* would be pressed down, what illustration did he use to make his point?
- **7.** According to verses 14-16, what would Israel NOT be able to rely upon when God's judgment came against them?
