 - c. What reasons were given for the proper treatment of slaves? (14 & 15)

- e. How was his decision documented if he chose to stay with his master?
- 4. What was to be done with the firstborn of the herds and flocks?
 - a. What rule was made about what *could not* be done with blemished animals?
 - b. What could they be used for?
 - c. What minor prophet later rebuked the people for offering blemished sacrifices?
 - d. What was NOT to be done with the blood of animals?
