 - c. By what time was a pledged cloak (garment) to be returned?
 - d. What about taking a widow's garment as a pledge?

- 5. What law was made for paying a poor man his wages?
- 6. We generally think of Ezekiel 18: 4 & 20 on this point, but what did Moses say about the crimes of fathers and sons?
- 7. Verses 18 and 22 remind the Jews that they were slaves in Egypt. From each respective context, what things were they not to do because of this history:
 - a. Verse 18?
 - b. Verse 22
