- 7. What then happened to Israel according to verses 15-18?
- 8. How did God then react to Israel's rejection of Him?
- 9. What punishments did God use against Israel? (23-24)
 - a. According to verses 26 & 27, for what reason did God not totally destroy Israel?

- 10. According to verses 28-30, what would the Jews have understood had they been wise?
- 11. At what point would God change His attitude towards His fallen people? (36)
- 12. Idolatry was one of the greatest sins of the Jewish people (v. 21 & 37), but according to verse 38, what could those gods not do for them?
- 13. How is God depicted in verses 41 & 42?
- 14. According to verse 47:
 - a. How was God's word not to be viewed?
 - b. How was God's word to be viewed?
- 15. Though chapter 34 contains the final information on the subject, what is recorded about Moses in the last verses of this chapter?
 - a. Why wasn't Moses permitted to go into the promised land?
