 - a. In what ways?
- 4. Verses 7, 8 & 12 address reasons as to why God chose the Jews as His special nation, and why not:
 - a. God chose them, NOT for what reason?
 - b. For what reasons DID He choose them?

- 5. What two aspects of God's nature are again emphasized? (vs. 9, 10)
- 6. Upon what condition would God maintain His covenant with the Jews? (12)
 - a. What blessings and benefits would be extended to the Jews if they did this? (13-16)

- 7. What past action by God were the Jews To recall to prevent them from becoming discouraged by the strength of their enemies?
- 8. According to verses 20-24, the conquest of Canaan would not be a merely *human* venture. What types of things would God *directly do* to assist the Jews?

9. What were the people *not* to bring into their houses? Why not?
