- 1) What “one more plague” would God bring against Egypt?
 - a. This was foretold before the first plague (4:23). What does this tell us about God’s knowledge?
- 2) What do we learn from verse 1 about how willing Pharaoh would be to let the Israelites go after the last plague?
- 3) Compare verse 2 with 3:22: Who is mentioned in 10:2 that is not mentioned in 3:22?
 - a. What two conditions had changed that encouraged the Egyptians to accommodate the Jews?
- 4) What two classes of people considered Moses “great”?
 - a. In what way was Moses “great?”
 - b. What group had changed their thinking in 8:18, 19?
 - c. What group did so in 9:20?
- 5) How did the plague of the firstborn differ from the other plagues with regard to *how it was implemented*?
- 6) What classes of people would be affected by the plague?
- 7) What point was made involving *dogs*?
- 8) How would the allegiance of Pharaoh’s servants change?
- 9) The timing of verse 8 belongs with 10:28:
 - a. What do we learn about Moses that was not mentioned in 10:28?
 - b. Was Moses wrong? (see Ephesians 4:26)
- 10) Explain the placement of verses 9 and 10: How does chapter 4:23 affect our understanding?
