- 1) What other Bible book and chapter addresses some of the events that are described in Galatians 2?
 - a) What was being unscripturally required of brethren? (*hint: Versus 1 and 5 of the chapter asked about in question 1*)
- 2) Why did Paul address certain influential brethren *privately* at Jerusalem?
 - a) Thought Question: Are there times and circumstances where issues need to be addressed privately among brethren today?
- 3) What did Paul mean when he said that he went to Jerusalem “by revelation?”
- 4) What was significant about *Titus*, particularly in view of the error that was being taught in various churches of Paul’s day?
 - a) How does the story of Titus differ from that of Timothy? (*see Acts 16:3*)
 - b) Contrasting Acts 16:3 with Titus 2:3, why was Timothy treated differently than Titus, and what lesson is there for us?
- 5) What tactic did the false brethren use to gain entrance among faithful saints?
 - a) What was Paul’s reaction to this effort?
- 6) What was Paul’s evaluation of those who seemed influential?

- 14) How is one "crucified with Christ?"
