

Questions On Hosea Chapter 5

1. Judgment would be carried out against what three classes of people?
2. According to verse 2 (as in 4:2 & 6:9), what sin was rampant in Israel?
 - A. To what degree were they involved in this sin?
3. Israel and Ephraim had “a spirit of harlotry.” What failures are associated with this spirit? (see verses 4, 5, 7 and 11)
4. The tribe of “Ephraim” is often singled out by Hosea. According to Isaiah 11:13, what was the relationship between Israel and Judah?
 - A. What important role did Shiloh (of Ephraim) play in Jewish history and what city was later assigned that role? (See Psalm 78:60, 67-69).
5. This chapter repeatedly mentions and warns “Judah,” though Judah had not yet stooped to Israel’s level of sin (1:7). Why is Judah mentioned by Hosea? (*Hint: this is akin to the point in Hosea 4:15*)
 - A. (5:5) Israel and Ephraim stumbled and _____ stumbled with them.
 - B. (5:12) God would be Ephraim like a _____ and to Judah like _____.

- C.** (5:13) Ephraim had a _____ and Judah had a _____.
- D.** (5:14) God would be a _____ to Ephraim, and like a _____ to Judah.
- 6.** According to verse 7, what kind of children had Israel produced?
- 7.** What was the purpose of the horns, crying and looking in verse 8?
- 8.** Judah would be like one who “removed a landmark.” Why is this analogy used? (*See Deuteronomy 27:17 for the significance*)
- 9.** To whom did Ephraim send for help when he saw his sickness?
- 10.** Verse 15 speaks of God returning to His “place.” What does this represent? And for how long would God remain in that place?
