- 2. According to Zophar, what did Job's many words not prove?
- 3. In verse 4, what claim by Job did Zophar well understand?
- 4. Eliphaz and Bildad had already argued that Job's condition and losses were God's punishment for his sin. In verse 6, how did Zophar actually intensify this allegation?
- 5. Zophar well illustrates the magnitude of God's knowledge and power. However, contrary to Zophar's implication, Job DID KNOW some things about God. What did Job know about God according to:
  - a. Job 1:1?
  - b. Job 1:5?
  - c. Job 6:10?
  - d. Job 10:7?
- 6. What does Zophar imply about Job in verses 11 & 12?

- 7. According to Zophar (13-14), what did Job need to do?
- 8. Zophar provides Job with a list of changes that would occur in Job's life if he repented and turned to God for mercy. List as many of these as you can think of:

- a. Were these blessings and rewards physical or spiritual?
- b. What does Zophar's list suggest about his concept of divine service regarding punishment and reward?
- 9. What had Job repeatedly requested that makes verse 20 appear to be an indictment of him?
