2. Who were the “mockers” of verse 2?
 - a. How were they characterized in verse 10?
 - b. According to verse 4, how did they end up in the condition described in verse 10?
3. What did Job want God to do for him? v.3
4. To whom was Job referring when he spoke of one “flattering” (denouncing or informing against) his friends?
5. What had Job become to those who considered him to be a hypocrite, and what did they do to him? (vs. 6, 8)
6. Job was obviously including himself in the classification of verse 9. What did he say would happen for the person who remained true to God through adversity?
7. As reflected in other statements by Job (10:21-22), he had a view of the afterlife, though not entirely accurate. How is his misconception perpetuated in the final verses of this chapter?
