- 2. Who were the "mockers" of verse 2?
 - a. How were they characterized in verse 10?
 - b. According to verse 4, how did they end up in the condition described in verse 10?
- 3. What did Job want God to do for him? v.3
- 4. To whom was Job referring when he spoke of one "flattering" (denouncing or informing against) his friends?
- 5. What had Job become to those who considered him to be a hypocrite, and what did they do to him? (vs. 6, 8)
- 6. Job was obviously including himself in the classification of verse 9. What did he say would happen for the person who remained true to God through adversity?
- 7. As reflected in other statements by Job (10:21-22), he had a view of the afterlife, though not entirely accurate. How is his misconception perpetuated in the final verses of this chapter?
