- 1. There are some similarities between the first few verses of this chapter and the 6th-12th verses of chapter one (the meeting between God and the angels, God's discussion with satan about Job, the limitations that God placed upon satan relating to Job):
 - a. In both meetings, where had satan been, and what had he been doing?
 - b. In both meetings, who introduced the character Job?
 - c. In both meetings, how did God describe Job?
 - d. In both meetings, God placed limits upon satan's actions: What limit did He place upon satan in this chapter?
- 2. How does the book of Job demonstrate that satan is not all-knowing?
- 3. How did satan afflict Job in this second encounter?
- 4. How bad was Job's condition:
 - a. According to Job? (feel free to generalize from passages like 3:1-2, 11; 6:2-3; 10:1; 17:1)

- b. According to the description in this chapter?
- c. From the words and suggestion of his wife?
- d. From the reaction of his friends?
- 5. What wise and good reason did Job give to his wife for why he would not blame God for his condition?
- 6. According to verse 11, for what initial reasons had Eliphaz, Bildad and Zophar gone to see Job?
 - a. (If you didn't already give this answer above 4d) How did these three men react upon seeing Job?
 - b. How long did they sit in silence?
 - c. What is suggested by this length of time spent in silent reaction?
