Job 22

- 1. In verses 1-4, Eliphaz chides Job with a series of questions for maintaining his integrity before God.
 - a. What do these questions suggest about Eliphaz's concept of God?
 - b. Is it really true that God takes no pleasure in the righteousness of humans? (consider Ezekiel 33:11 & 1 Thessalonians 4:1)
- 2. How does Eliphaz describe Job's alleged sin in verse 5?
- 3. In verses 6, 7 and 9, what sins did Eliphaz charge Job with committing?

- a. In contrast, according to Job 29:12-17 what did Job say that he had done for people?
- b. How do we harmonize Eliphaz's charges in Job 22:6-9 with Job's account in Job 29:12-17?
- 4. Eliphaz charges Job with saying, "What does God know?" Had Job actually said this?

- a. What had Job said about the wicked (chap. 21) that led Eliphaz to assume that this (question 4) was Job's view?
- b. What caution does this provide with respect to mere *inference* versus *necessary* inference?
- 5. To what old event does Eliphaz likely refer in verse 16?
 - a. How does Eliphaz use this event in support of his position?
 - b. In 22:17 Eliphaz quoted Job from 21:14: In what context (to what event) did Eliphaz now apply Job's quote?
- 6. Some believe that the "fire" of verse 20 refers to what old event?
- 7. What did Eliphaz call upon Job to do in verses 21-23?
- 8. In verses 23-30, Eliphaz cites the various ways in which Job would be benefited if he were to repent of his (alleged) sin. List as many of the benefits as you can:
