1. Job begins a lengthy reply to his friends, which runs from this chapter through chapter 31. In verses 2-4 he asks Bildad (the others are likely included) what he had accomplished with his speeches. **Using your own words, give a summary of his questions:**

2. Job proceeds to show Bildad what it really looks like to exalt God's power and majesty. Job describes God's power over His creation — particularly, people, places and things:
 - a. According to verse 14, where is this power seen?

 - b. What did Job say about “the dead” and the place of the dead? (5-6)

 - c. What did he say about how God supports the earth?

 - d. What observation did he make about water and a seeming impossibility regarding water in the atmosphere?

 - e. What did he say about the shape of the earth? (in speaking of the horizon)

 - f. What adorns the heavens? (According to David, Psalm 19:1, what do the heavens “declare?”)

 - g. The last phrase in verse 13 is variously translated. If it refers to Leviathan, then what is Job's point?
