3. To whom is Job speaking in verses 5 and 12?
4. What did Job claim to be in verse 6?
 - a. What would Job’s heart not do to him, and what does this mean?
5. In verses 8-10, Job asks a series of rhetorical questions about the hypocrite. What was Job’s point?
6. After many wordy rebuttals to his friends, to what does Job appeal in verse 12 in order to “teach” them about God?
7. What things did Job cite as the heritage or portion of the wicked?
 - a. What spiritual consequence is mentioned in verse 19?
