- 1. This chapter describes what time in Job's life?
- 2. In chapter 22:1-9, Eliphaz had suggested that Job had wronged and mistreated weak and vulnerable people. How is that claim answered in this chapter?
- 3. According to verse 2 (in the KJV, NKJV, ASV, NASB, ESV, NIV and others), how much time had passed since Job was first afflicted?
- 4. In verses 2-5, Job used various expressions to describe God's view of him at the time prior to his affliction. Give a brief summary of Job's point about God's view of him at that time:
  - a. Thought question: Had God's view of Job really changed?
- 5. Verses 6 and 7 describe how much better Job's life was *physically* and *socially* prior to his affliction. Explain this difference:
- 6. In verses 8-10 and 21, Job describes the past views of various classes of people towards him. How was Job viewed by:
  - a. The young men (8)?
  - b. The princes (9)?
  - c. The nobles (10)?
  - d. The men (21)?

- e. What did it mean that the men kept silence at his council (22)?
- 7. According to verses 12-17, what classes of people were helped by Job?

- 8. What did Job mean when he said that he (had supposed) that he would "die in his nest?"
- 9. What was Job's point when he said that his roots were spread out to the waters?
  - a. In Psalm 1:3, what type of person did David describe as being like a tree planted by streams of water?
- 10. Job said that the people "waited" for him "as for rain." In this context, what did they "wait" for him to do?
- 11. How did the people react if Job mocked them?
- 12. According to verse 25, how respected was Job among the people?
