- 3. What did Job say that it was for a righteous person to commit iniquity? (v. 3)
- 4. Most of this chapter is written in an "If / Then" format, in which Job suggests some possibility, then states the consequence. How is this a defense for Job's integrity?
- 5. What would be the consequence IF Job had:
 - a. Walked in falsehood or ran to deceit? (5)
 - b. Turned aside and his heart gone after his eyes? (7)

Continued: What would be the consequence if Job had:

- c. Been enticed toward another woman? (9)
- d. Rejected the cause of a male or female servant? (13)
- e. Withheld from the poor, failed to help widows and orphans, or harmed any of them? (16-22)
- f. Trusted in wealth or worshipped idols? (24-28)
- g. Rejoiced at the ruin of his enemies, concealed his iniquities, or abused his land and failed to make rent payments? (29-40)
