- 1. According to the KJV, NKJV, ASV, NASB and NIV in verse 2, Elihu accused Job of claiming to be "more righteous than God." Where did Job ever make such a claim?
  - a. Had Job made such a claim, would he have been right?
  - b. What common rhetorical method and logical fallacy did Elihu here use as the basis of his accusation?
- 2. In verse 3, Elihu appears to have misunderstood the context of Job 9:22-24 and 12:6 (and chapters 21 and 24). Was Job's point in those passages to argue that there was no purpose in living righteously? (see 13:15 or 19:25-26 for help)
  - a. What was Job's point in those passages?
- 3. In verses 6 & 7, what two conditions of man did Elihu say have no direct impact upon God?
- 4. In verse 8, what did Elihu accuse Job of being?
- 5. Verses 9-12 address the cries of the oppressed:
  - a. What type of cry does God ignore?
  - b. What type of cry does God hear?
- 6. What will God not listen to, according to Elihu?
- 7. According to Elihu, why were Job's words "without knowledge?"
