 - c. There are differences between a "hireling" and a owner/shepherd What does a hireling do when danger approaches? What is the good shepherd willing to do for his sheep?
 - d. When the good shepherd speaks, what do the sheep do? (vs. 3, 26, 27)
 - e. Thought question: Why are disciples compared to "sheep?"
- 3. Who were the "other sheep" of verse 16? The Mormons claim that this passage refers to them! Really? (for help, see Matthew 4:15-16)
- 4. What did Jesus say that He was able to do with His life?
- 5. Verse 19 says that there was division among them "again" over Jesus. To what earlier episode(s) of division does likely refer?
- 6. What did many people say that Jesus had?

- 7. What argument did others make in His defense? (21)
- 8. What was the Jewish feast of Dedication?
- 9. Verse 23 of this chapter provides a definition for how John uses the word "Temple" in some other places what is it?
- 10. Concerning what fact or claim, did the Jews suggest that Jesus had not been "plain" enough in His teaching?
- 11. How are verses 28 & 29 misused by denominationalists? (That is, what doctrine do they try to support from them?)
- 12. Why did the Jews "again" try to kill Jesus? (31)
 - a. For what previous reasons did they try to kill Him?
 - b. What did the Jews then try to do in verse 39? Why, that time?
- 13. What did Jesus mean when He said that "the Scripture cannot be broken?"
- 14. By what action and standard did Jesus ask the Jews to either believe on Him, or not believe on Him? (37-38)
- 15. Where did Jesus then go, and what happened there?
