1. What place is described in verses 1-3?
 - a. In what other book and chapter does John write about this place?
(hint: As does Jesus here, John there uses physical materials and descriptions to describe this place.)
 - b. How is Heaven described in Revelation 21:4?
 - c. What was Jesus going there to do?
2. Complete the old adage that is based upon John 14:1-3: “Heaven is a _____ place for a _____ people.”
3. This chapter focuses largely upon the questions and misconceptions of what three apostles?
4. How was Jesus using the word “way” in verse 4?
 - a. What misconception did Thomas have about this?
 - b. What all does Jesus claim to be? (according to this chapter)
 - c. What had Jesus previously claimed to be? (for help, 8:12 & 11:25)
5. What request did Philip make of Jesus, and what response did Jesus give to him?

6. It has been rightly said that there is graduated *authority* in the Godhead, but NOT graduated *deity*. Explain how verses 9 & 10 of this chapter support this explanation:
- a. How do verses 10 and 20 describe the mutual deity of the Father and Son?
 - b. In what sense is the Father “greater” than the Son?
7. What prayer principle is taught in verses 13 and 14?
8. What will one do if he truly loves God?
9. Jesus had earlier mentioned the coming of the Holy Spirit (John 7:39), but John chapters 14, 15 and 16 begin the fuller explanation of His coming. What do we learn about the role and mission of the Holy Spirit from verses 16, 17 and 26 of *this* chapter?
10. What kind of “peace” did Jesus leave with His disciples?
- a. Explain the aspect of this peace that is discussed in Ephesians 2:14:
 - b. Philippians 4:7?
11. As in 13:19, Jesus again cites the purpose of fulfilled prophecy (14:29). Explain the significance of fulfilled prophecy:
