- 5. Describe a "manslayer" according to Joshua 20:3, 5; Deuteronomy 19:4 and Numbers 35:12 with regard to his:
 - a. Action? (what had he done?)
 - b. Intent?
 - c. What illustration of this is used in Deuteronomy 19:5?

- 6. Was the manslayer "deserving" of death? (Deut. 19:6)
- 7. According to Numbers 35:16-24:
 - a. What was (is) the difference between a "manslayer" and a "murderer?"
 - b. According to Mosaic Law, what was to be done to murderers? (Ex. 21:12)
 - c. What was the penalty for murder under the patriarchal system? (Gen. 9:6)
- 8. Who all qualified to be protected by the refuge-city system?
