- 2. This chapter adds information about how long the priests stood in the river bed: How long were the priests with the ark to stand in the Jordan river bed? (v.10)
- 3. What happened when the priests walked up out of the river bed? (18)
- 4. Where were the river stones eventually set up?
 - a. For what purpose were the stones set up? (vs. 6-7, 21-24)
- 5. As a historical note, what is said about the sons of Reuben, Gad and Manasseh?
- 6. As we learned from chapter 3, the drying of the Jordan river had certain implications. According to this chapter, what implications did it have and lessons did it teach regarding:
 - a. Joshua? (14)
 - b. Future generations? (6, 7, 21-24)
 - c. Other nations? (23-24)
 - d. Israel at that time? (23-24)
