- 8. Who succeeded Jephthah as judge, and how long did he judge Israel?
 - a. What observation is made about marriage arrangements for this judge's sons and daughters?
- 9. Who succeeded Ibzan as judge, and how long did he judge Israel?
- 10. Who succeeded Elon as judge, and how long did he judge Israel?
 - a. What observation is made about Abdon's sons and grandsons?
- 11. *Thought Question:* By the time of the end of Judges 12, what pattern has emerged about the general and respective locations of the judges? (note, Samson, of chapters 13 and following, will come from the Danite city of Zorah)
