- 3. What cultural practice is mentioned in verse 10?
- 4. What riddle did Samson pose to the 30 companions that were provided for him?
 - a. What challenge (wager) was proposed about solving this riddle?

- 5. In order to learn the answer to the riddle, what threat did the 30 men make to Samson's wife?
 - a. What reason did Samson give his wife for not telling her the answer to his riddle?
 - b. Samson gave in to his wife after her pleading and weeping for how long?
 - c. What interesting expression did he use to the 30 in telling them how they had learned the answer to his riddle?
- 6. After losing the bet, how did Samson acquire the 30 changes of clothing for the 30 men?
 - a. What "Spirit" came upon Samson enabling him to do this?
 - b. In what connection was this "Spirit" expression earlier used in this chapter?
