- 1. Judges 5 records Deborah's song. Using **general** descriptions, what types of things are acknowledged in this song?
- 2. Psalm 145:4-12 is also instructive regarding the purpose of spiritual songs. Again, give a general description of the categories or types of things addressed in a spiritual song:
- 3. According to verse 7, who penned Deborah's song?
 - a. Reminder: What was Deborah according to Judges 4:4?
- 4. This song praises God for various things:
 - a. Why does she bless (thank) God according to verse 2?
 - b. What great Israeli victories happened immediately after Edom? (see Joshua 2:10; **9:10**)
 - c. What even earlier historic occasion did Deborah cite? (v. 5)
 - d. What more recent hero and heroine did she name? (6)

- 5. Who typically rode on "white" donkeys? (see Judges 12:14 to learn about the typical use of special animals)
- 6. In verses 14-18, Deborah's song mentions several tribes:
 - a. Which ones are commended for helping?
 - b. Which ones are criticized?
 - c. Skipping to v. 23, which city was cursed?
 - d. Why was Edom condemned by Obadiah? (Obadiah 1:11-12)
- 7. Zebulun and Naphtali were highly motivated to fight. Their territories were the nearest to Jabin's. How would this have likely affected their lives more than people who lived farther away?
- 8. By God's own testimony (v. 12), Deborah was herself a courageous woman, but what woman does Deborah highly praise in verses 24-27?
 - a. What did this bold woman do?
- 9. What other woman is introduced in verse 28?
 - a. What point is made about her?
