- 1) What two significant “years” are discussed in this chapter?
- 2) What was to be done with the land every 7th year?
 - a) What would the people eat during that year?
 - b) What “blessing” would God send them in the sixth year?
- 3) (Thought Question) Genesis, Exodus and Leviticus had discussed several “sevens” and “sevenths.” Think of as many of these as you can:
- 4) What was to happen every “Jubilee” (fiftieth) year?
 - a) On what day was the Jubilee year announced?
- 5) (Thought Question) What spiritual lesson was taught by the practices of the sabbatical and jubilee years? (hint: see verse 23)

- 6) Who was to redeem the property of a “poor” man?
- 7) What redemption exception applied to a house in a “walled city,” but not to a house in “open” country?
- 8) In the case of Levites, what was different about a “house” and “pastureland” with respect to Jubilee?
- 9) What support/assistance rules were made regarding one who became “unable to support himself?”
- 10) What rules are made regarding the acquisition of slaves?
 - a) What statement is twice made about how a slave owner WAS NOT to rule over his slave?
- 11) What was to be done for slaves in the year of Jubilee? (you may have already included this in your answer above)
- 12) What reason is given as to why the Jews were to keep these rules? (see v. 55)
