1. What is the main subject in verses 1-10 of this chapter?
  
2. Describe the scroll that God held in His right hand:
  - a. What problem existed relating to the opening of this scroll?
  
  - b. Who was able to open the scroll?
  
  - c. Why was He alone able to open the scroll?
  
  - d. Give a description of Him from verses 5 & 6:
  
3. Jesus is called both a Lion and a Lamb. Why? (What is the significance of each animal as applied to Christ?)
  
4. Why did the Lamb have the appearance of one that “had been slain?”
  
5. What was the significance of “seven horns and seven eyes?”

6. What did the four living creatures and twenty-four elders do when Christ took the scroll from the Father?
  
7. Some people cite the “harps” of Revelation 5:8; 14:2 & 15:2 as proof that we are authorized to use mechanical instruments of music in worship to God today. However, Revelation also mentions that the 4 creatures and 24 elders had “golden bowls full of incense.” This is symbolic language, for what are we told that the golden bowls represented?
  - a. The “harps” were also symbolic. Using Revelation 14:2-3 and 15:2-3, what did the “harps” represent?
  
  - b. What does 1 Corinthians 15:50 say about physical substance and heaven?
  
8. Like Revelation 1:6, what does Rev. 5:10 again tell us that saints are?
  
9. How many angels were gathered around the throne?
  
10. What song did they sing?
  
11. According to verse 13, who did the 4 creatures and 24 elders worship? (look carefully!)
