- 4. What does Paul called for in verses 5-7?
 - a. According to 1 Cor. 1:10, how is this condition achieved?
 - b. Who prayed for this condition in John 17:20-21?
- 5. What did the Old Testament teach about the Gentiles and salvation?
- 6. With what type of music would the Gentiles praise God? (9)
- 7. In what did Paul have confidence in the Roman saints? (14)

- a. Even so, what did Paul still need to do for them? (15)
- 8. What reason did Paul give for being late in coming to Rome?
- 9. What was Paul's objective with regard to the Gentiles? (18)
 - a. What methods did he use? (see 18, 19, 20)
- 10. What did Paul hope that the saints at Rome would do for him for his trip to Spain?
 - a. According to verse 32, what other motive did Paul have?
- 11. Paul's reference to "Macedonia and Achaia" in Romans 15:26 connects this work to the one that is addressed in 1 Cor. 16:1-3 and 2 Cor. 8:1-4 & 9. What need was this?
 - a. What two conditions are listed in Romans 15:26 as a reason for providing this help?
- 12. What 3 *persons* or *beings* are referenced in verse 30?
 - a. Though the term is not used by Bible writers, what term do we often use to describe these three beings?
- 13. Why did Paul solicit the prayers of the Romans saints (30-31)?
