

## Romans 6

1. How did Paul address the possible reasoning that the more one sinned, the more God's grace removed the sin?
  - a. Verses 14 & 15 are related to verse 1. What factor does Paul add to the equation in these verses?
  
2. Verses 2-4 draw a parallel between the death, burial and resurrection of Christ and certain actions that are taken in salvation:
  - a. How (or to what) does a Christian "die?"
  
  - b. How is such a person "buried?"
  
  - c. How is he "raised" or resurrected?
  
3. What does the "old man" or "old self" of verse 6 represent?
  
  
4. Paul sometimes personifies sin in this letter. How does he do this in verse 12?
  - a. Why does he speak of sin in this way? (see verse 19 for help)
  
  
5. According to verse 13, the "parts" or "members" of the body can be used in what two possible ways? (you might also consider verse 16)

6. What does verse 16 teach about obedience?
  
7. What “form” or “mold” or “pattern” of doctrine did the saints at Rome obey? (for help on verse 17, see verses 3-4)
  - a. Why was Paul thankful to God? (v. 18)
  
  - b. What is obedience “from the heart?”
  
8. Considering verses 18, 20, 23:
  - a. When one is free from sin, he is a slave to \_\_\_\_\_?
  
  - b. One is free from righteousness when he is a \_\_\_\_\_ to sin.
  
  - c. The wages of sin is \_\_\_\_\_?
  
  - d. The gift of God is \_\_\_\_\_?
