- 3. After Boaz found out who Ruth was, what did she then ask of him? (7)
- 4. Not only did Boaz agree to her request, according to verses 8 & 9 what more did he offer to her?
- 5. What did Boaz instruct his young male workers *not to do* with regard to Ruth?
- 6. Ruth asked Boaz why she had found favor in his sight particularly in view of what fact about her? (see v. 10)
 - a. What answer did Boaz give to her?
 - b. What was it about Ruth that so impressed Boaz? (depending upon how fully you answered 5(a), you may have already answered this)

- c. According to verse 13, what affect did his words have upon Ruth?
- 7. What did Boaz invite Ruth to do in verse 14?
- 8. In verses 15 & 16, what two things did Boaz order his young men to do that would directly benefit Ruth?
- 9. How much barley did Ruth glean?
 - a. What did she do with what remained of the grain after her own use?
- 10. What was Naomi's reaction when she discovered who Ruth had worked for?
- 11. What was Naomi's reaction when she discovered that Boaz had instructed Ruth to not glean in any other field?
 - a. What was the likely reason(s) for Boaz's request?
- 12. Where did Ruth live at this time?
