- 2. The levirate marriage law of Deuteronomy 25:5-10 provides background for this chapter and the next one. Explain this law:
 - a. In Matthew 22:23-28, the levirate law is alluded to by the Sadducees. In their scenario how many brothers were involved?
 - b. Thought question: Why did the Sadducees invoke the levirate marriage law with Jesus? (What were they trying to disprove?)
- 3. What did Naomi advise Ruth to do? (vs 3 & 4)
 - a. Was anything immoral implied in Naomi's advice?
 - b. Related to this, what observation did Boaz make about Ruth in verse 11?
 - c. How does verse 2 show that Naomi was making plans for Ruth's approach to Boaz? (What was she keeping track of?)
- 4. What was the purpose of Ruth laying down at Boaz's uncovered feet?

- 5. What happened at midnight?
- 6. How did Boaz react to Ruth's actions and how did he then commend and compliment Ruth?
- 7. Of what did Ruth inform Boaz (that she knew) about their relationship?
- 8. What did Boaz *also know* about this relationship? (12-13)
 - a. In accordance with the levirate law of Deuteronomy 25, what did Boaz propose to be done at this point?
- 9. What did Boaz give to Ruth and for what purpose?
- 10. What did Boaz not want people to know about Ruth's whereabouts?
- 11. What did Naomi call Ruth when she returned home?
- 12. Referring most likely to the process mentioned by Boaz in verse 13, what did Naomi advise Ruth to do in verse 18?
