1. Though Paul had given qualifications for appointing local church elders (chap. 1), who is represented by the “rulers and authorities” of this chapter?
 - a. According to Romans 13:1-4, what are the primary duties of civil government? ((2 general areas)
2. In verses 1, 8 & 14 of this chapter, Paul speaks of “good works.” According to Ephesians 2:10 and 2 Timothy 3:17, how can one know what is a “good work?”
3. According to verse 2, what things should we *avoid* in our treatment of others?
 - a. What things are we to do in our treatment of others?
 - b. What are some ways of “speaking evil” of other people?
4. What characteristics of the unsaved are listed in verse 3?
5. From verses 4-7, list the various things that are involved in salvation:
 - a. Paul does exclude certain “works” as being salvational (v. 5). List some of these types of works:
 - b. What is the “washing of regeneration?”

6. How does Paul describe good works in the last part of verse 8?
7. Verse 9 further develops the warning of verse 2, to avoid quarreling. What does Paul add in verse 9?
8. Verses 10 and 11 provide instructions for dealing with heretics:
 - a. What is a heretic?
 - b. How is he to be dealt with?
9. Who was Paul sending to Titus?
 - a. Upon their arrival, what was Titus to do?
10. What was Titus to do regarding Zenas and Apollos?
11. Verse 14 again mentions good works. Considering the last parts of verses 13 and 14, what particular good works is Paul here speaking of?
