

Ephesians 5

- 1) Beginning at verse 17 of chapter 4 and continuing through chapter 6, Paul addresses practical issues: What 2 categories are addressed in this chapter? (*hint: verses 1-17 and verses 21-33*)
- 2) How can one be a “follower of God?” (1 & 2)
- 3) How was Christ’s love expressed to the world? (2)
- 4) What things are not “becoming” of saints? (3-4)
- 5) What is the most common means of *deceiving* people? (*hint: 5:6 & 4:14*)
- 6) There are two specific *fellowship* statements in this chapter - (v. 7 = “partakers” & 11 = “fellowship”), and they emphasize different aspects and possibilities with regard to fellowship:
 - a) What is warned against in verse 7?
 - b) What is warned against in verse 11?
 - c) What is warned against in 2 John 10-11?
 - d) We usually think of “fellowship” in connection with good and right things and relationships. How is it different in the above verses?
 - e) Along with not fellowshiping sinners, what else were saints not to do with regard to sinful activities? (*hint: 12*)

- 7) How does one “prove what is acceptable to the Lord?” (*hint: Acts 17:2,3, 11; 28:23*)

- 8) Paul spoke in 4:1 about how Christians are to “walk.” What does he say in this chapter about how we are to walk, and what does he mean? (vs. 15, 16)

- 9) How are Christians to produce music in honor to God?
 - a) What *instruments* are used according to verse 19?
 - b) How do denominationalists misuse Ephesians 5:19?

- 10) What two relationships are alternately discussed in verses 22-31? (see v. 32)
 - a) What primary responsibility does the wife have to her husband? (vs. 22, 24)
 - i) What is added in Titus 2:4-5?
 - b) What primary responsibility does the husband have to his wife? (v. 25)
 - i) How is this responsibility broken down by Paul (29)?

- 11) According to Eph. 5:32-33, what was Paul’s main point in verses 21-31?
