Questions On Ecclesiastes 8

- 1. How does wisdom affect one's "face" (and what does this mean?) v. 1
- 2. Several verses in this chapter speak of civil government. Verses 2-7 speak of responsibilities to civil kings (civil authorities). Verse two speaks of the *seriousness* of this duty. What does 1 Chronicles 29:24 say that the princes and mighty men did when Solomon became king?
 - a) According to Eccl. 8:2, Who else must be considered and is honored by this commitment?
 - b) What makes rebellion dangerous? (3)
 - c) Because of his authority, what should one *not do* to the king? (4)
 - d) What does one not have to fear or experience if he keeps the king's orders? (5)
 - e) What did God ordain *in the New Testament* about obeying civil government? (Romans 13:3-4; 1 Peter 2:14)
 - f) Verses 6 and 7 connect this duty of service to the king to the "time and order" passage of Eccl. 3:1-11. This would mean that submission to civil authority is simply a part of man's time on the earth. Therefore, one should not challenge civil authorities *unless what?* (Acts 4:29).
 - g) Verse 9 speaks of the possibility of a king (tyrant) ruling over others in a way that results in what?

- h) What king (close to Solomon) is a good example of this according to 1 Chronicles 12?
- i) Verse 11 teaches what about the treatment (prosecution and punishment) of criminals?
- 3. The NASB and NIV have "wind" in place of "spirit" in verse 8, but the immediate context seems to favor "spirit" (especially when comparing 11:5). If this is correct, what power does man *not have* in the day of his death?
 - a) From what "war" is there no "discharge?" (8)
- 4. Though it seems unfair, what sometimes happens with (for) evil people according to verses 12 and 14 (and as seen in 7:15)?
 - a) Though it may not be apparent in this present life, what eventually happens to the wicked according to verse 13 and Eccl. 12:14?
- 5. Like 3:13 and 5:18-19, what does verse 15 teach about what one should enjoy during life under the sun?
- 6. As we saw in 3:11, what limitation is placed upon humans (even wise ones) according to verse 17?
